Emergency Financial Aid

Organizations like the National Network to End Domestic Violence offer emergency funds for escape, relocation, and immediate needs. Many local shelters provide small grants.



Economic Empowerment

Allstate Foundation's Purple Purse program and local workforce centers provide job training, financial literacy courses, and employment assistance for survivors.



Housing Resources

Contact the National Safe Housing Alliance or call 211 to locate emergency shelters, transitional housing programs, and rental assistance in your area.

State Coalition Website

Search "[Your State] domestic violence coalition" to find your state's central resource organization with local shelter directories.

State Attorney General

Visit your state AG's website for victim services, crime victim compensation programs, and legal assistance referrals.

211 Information Line

Dial 211 from any phone to connect with trained specialists who can direct you to local services, shelters, and support groups.

State Bar Association

Access pro bono legal services and lawyer referral programs through your state bar's public service division.
